This result is a testimony to the grit and determination of HimJyotians. Though all our girls belong to under privileged families, some have surmounted exceptional circumstances to shine.

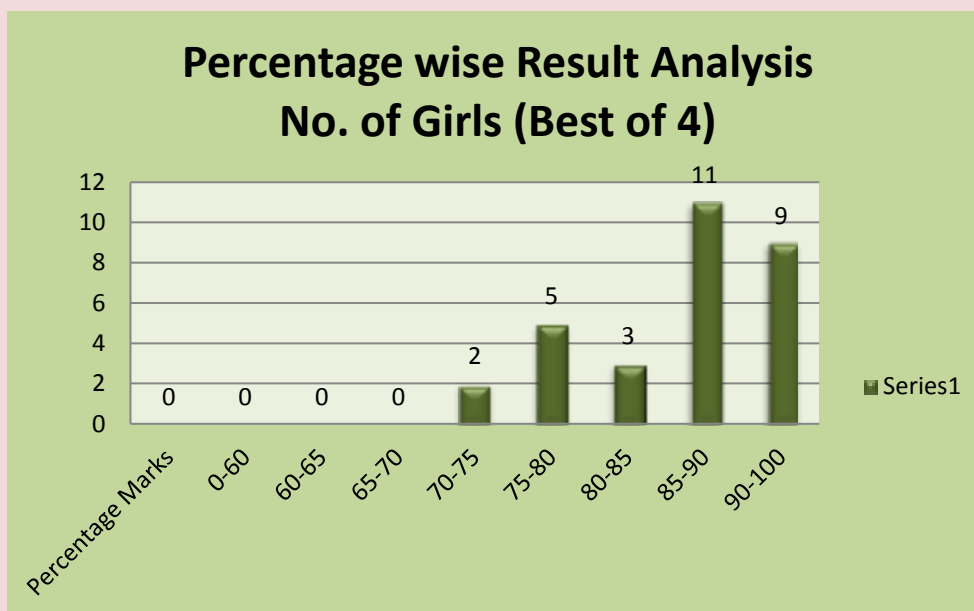
Our School topper, Swati Kainthura's father is a peon.

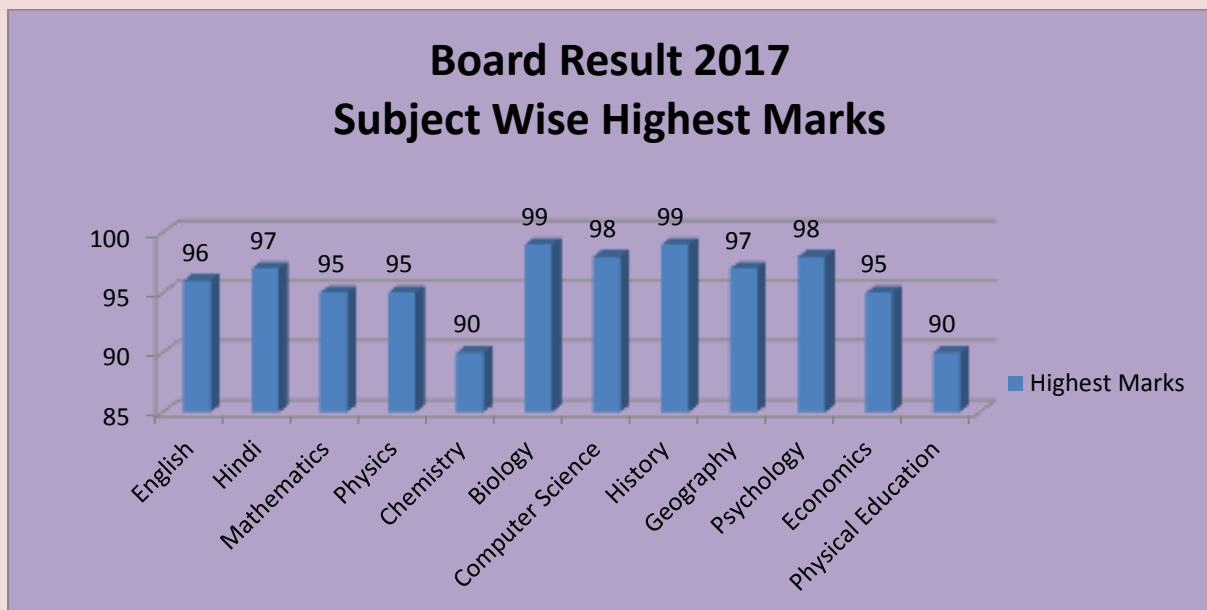
